In an opening brief filed Feb. 13, Dr. Sunil Aggarwal said the DEA ignored his arguments in favor of rescheduling psilocybin and violated the law by not consulting the U.S. Food and Drug Administration to assess psilocybin's potential uses, adding that the DEA's assessment process was fatally flawed.
