



This October, the Department of Education is slated to make sweeping [changes](#) across [Title IX](#)'s implementing regulations. The expansive proposed revisions would impact college and university [grievance procedures](#), which are designed to promptly and equitably resolve complaints alleging discrimination on the basis of sex.

Federal departments and agencies typically make only micro-adjustments to general and permanent rules in the [Code of Federal Regulations](#). But the DOE's 2022 proposed Title IX [rulemaking](#) stood out because of its size (700 [pages](#)) and its [ambition](#).
