

USCIS Filing Fee Increase

On August 3, 2020, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services issued a [final rule](#) making significant changes to immigration and naturalization related filing fees. The rule goes into effect on October 2, 2020, and the weighted average fee increase is 20%. Here are some examples of fee changes for common business immigration related filings:

- I-129 Petition for Immigrant Worker for H-1B employees has been increased by 21% from \$460 to \$555.
- I-140 Immigrant Petition for Alien Worker has been reduced by 11% from \$700 to \$555.
- I-756 Application for Employment Authorization (non-DACA) has been increased by 34% from \$410 to \$550.
- N-400 Application for Naturalization has been increased by 81% from \$640 to \$1,160.
